- New Mexico's Gender Policies Clash With Public Opinion: The Reproductive and Gender-Affirming Healthcare Act, or <u>HB 7</u>, mandates that public bodies—including schools—protect access to gender transition, including social, hormonal, and surgical transition.
- Social Transition Puts Children on the Track to Irreversible Medicalization: Social transition—the change of names and pronouns—can cause lasting psychosocial harm, and puts children on the track to irreversible medicalization.
 - O Between <u>61% and 98%</u> of children who are left alone stop identifying with the opposite sex.
- Schools Allow Children to Transition Behind Their Parents' Backs:
 Eight school districts in New Mexico—<u>Albuquerque</u>, <u>Gadsden</u>
 Independent, <u>Gallup-McKinley</u>, <u>Las Cruces</u>, <u>Los Alamos</u>, <u>Moriarty-Edgewood</u>, <u>Rio Rancho</u>, and <u>Santa Fe</u>—have explicit policies allowing children to transition socially without parental knowledge, never mind consent.
- Transition Comes with Immediate Health Risks: Puberty blockers, cross-sex hormones, and sex-trait modification procedures come with immediate health risks, up to and including lifelong sterility and loss of sexual function.

- >> Repeal HB 7.
- >> Repeal school district policies that allow minors to transition behind their parents' backs.
- Pass laws protecting minors from accessing puberty blockers, hormones, and surgeries that cause irreversible harm.
- >> Review school curricula and make them transparent to parents.
