Good Evening,

More freedom, more opportunity, more flourishing: Independent Women's Forum's mission is to enlist more people to support the rule of law, economic liberty, and limited government so we can create a fair and flourishing society with opportunity for all.

For more than 25 years, IWF has been reaching women and those outside of the conservative base, correcting misperceptions about how policy works in practice, challenging stereotypes about champions of freedom, and encouraging more people to join our cause.

This year, we launched Independent Women's Law Center. While the Left has several resource-rich feminist legal groups, until now there has been no organization providing a center-right female perspective on legal issues. Independent Women's Law Center fills that gap. The center's talented female lawyers will weigh in directly on key court cases, provide media analysis and commentary on legal issues, support the confirmation of constitutionalist judges, and build a greater appreciation for our constitutional system.

Independent Women's Forum also took our work directly to key states to build awareness of how proposed state paid leave entitlements, the Equal Rights Amendment, and efforts to undermine the Electoral College would backfire on Americans. We are proud of our impact. As Colorado State Senator Rep. Susan Beckman put it, "I truly believe that without Independent Women's Forum, the FAMLI Act entitlement program would be a done deal in Colorado."

Independent Women's Forum advocates for more choice in education; a robust, transparent healthcare marketplace; and a dynamic economy that provides opportunity for all.

The principles we advance improve lives, not only in the United States, but across the globe. That's why IWF's Claudia Rosett went to Hong Kong to report on their incredible fight for human freedom, and why IWF has been sharing stories of women from North Korea, Guatemala, Senegal, and elsewhere, who are dedicating their lives to advancing individual liberty, economic freedom, and basic human rights.

Woman of Valor Award

The Barbara K. Olson Woman of Valor Award has been bestowed upon some of the most influential female leaders in the country since 2004, and recognizes extraordinary women who have demonstrated a firm commitment to liberty, limited government, personal responsibility, and whose work has helped make significant improvements to the lives of women and their families.

Resilience Award

The Resilience Award recognizes an individual who exhibits bravery, courage, and inner strength and helps create stronger, more vibrant communities by encouraging more respectful dialogue and civic engagement.

Gentleman of Distinction Award

The Gentleman of Distinction Award celebrates a gentleman who has worked to create a stronger society that protects and encourages human flourishing through individual liberty, while strengthening relationships and providing opportunities for women, men, and their families.



Woman of Valor U.S. Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos

Betsy DeVos serves as the 11th U.S. Secretary of Education. For more than three decades, she has been on the front lines of the fight for better and more options for students of all ages. She has already helped expand opportunities for students in 25 states and the District of Columbia.

As Secretary, she recognizes that every student is unique and each one needs the freedom

to pursue education in ways and places that work for them. Her focus is on expanding education freedom, transforming Federal Student Aid, opening multiple pathways to higher education, and returning power to students, parents, teachers, and local communities. Her leadership has already resulted in expanding 529 education savings plans, restoring yearround access to Pell Grants, creating new partnerships for apprenticeship opportunities, increasing innovative options for higher education and pulling back federal overreach by the Department.

Prior to being confirmed, Secretary DeVos served as chairman of the Windquest Group, an enterprise and investment management firm. She also served on the boards of numerous national and local education, charitable, and civic organizations.

The daughter of a public school teacher, Secretary DeVos received a B.A. from Calvin College and has been married to her husband Dick DeVos for 40 years. Together they have four children and eight grandchildren.

This includes traveling to Afghanistan on a USO Tour with Gary Sinise, assisting in the clothing line called Nine Line, and taking part in many charity motorcycle rides to help raise funds for our fallen.

Kristy has appeared on Fox News to discuss Hollywood's treatment of the President and their condemnation of those who hold and voice different political beliefs.

In spite of the risk of industry censure, Kristy is an outspoken advocate for her own political beliefs, employing wit and civility, even when others in Hollywood use far less tact and humility.

Kristy is happily married and lives with her husband and son in California.



Gentleman of Distinction Lawrence A. Kudlow

Lawrence A. Kudlow serves as Assistant to the President for Economic Policy and Director of the National Economic Council. He leads the coordination of President Donald J. Trump's domestic and global economic policy agenda.

During President Trump's campaign, Mr. Kudlow served as a tax and economic advisor.

Prior to the White House, Mr. Kudlow was a

CNBC Senior Contributor and host of CNBC's primetime show "The Kudlow Report." He also served as chief economist and senior managing director of Bear Stearns & Company.

During President Reagan's first term, Mr. Kudlow was associate director for economics and planning at the Office of Management and Budget, where he was engaged in the development of the Administration's economic and budget policy.

Mr. Kudlow is the author of "JFK and the Reagan Revolution: A Secret History of American Prosperity" and "American Abundance: The New Economic and Moral Prosperity."

Heather's background is in finance, public policy, and media, all happily combined with an inclination to make trouble.

She serves as chairman of Independent Women's Forum (IWF), as well as being Chairman and CEO of its advocacy arm, Independent Women's Voice (IWV). In addition, she serves on the boards of both the Philanthropy Roundtable and the Hoover Institution. She is also a commissioner on the Women's Suffrage

Centennial Commission helping to coordinate the nationwide 100th Anniversary of the 19th Amendment.

Heather has been recognized as one of Campaigns & Elections 50 Most Influential People for her issue advocacy and a leader who will shape future election cycles. In addition to receiving numerous awards for her innovative approaches to campaign messaging, in 2016 she also received the American Spectator's first "Lifetime Service to the Movement" Award.

She writes most frequently for the *Wall Street Journal* where she used to be an editorial writer and she often does television and radio to discuss public policy and politics—indeed if you are ever up early, you may see her cohosting "Mornings with Maria" on Fox Business.



Carrie Lukas

Carrie is the president of Independent Women's Forum and vice president at Independent Women's Voice. She is the author of *Checking Progressive Privilege*, an Encounter Broadside released summer 2019, and co-author of *Liberty Is No War on Women*, and author of *The Politically Incorrect Guide to Women, Sex, and Feminism*, which was published by Regnery Publishing.

Lukas's writing has appeared in *The Wall Street*

Journal, The Washington Post, USA Today, and *The New York Post.* She contributes to the National Review and Forbes.com, She's testified before the House Ways and Means Subcommittee on Social Security and House Committee on Education and the Workforce subcommittee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions on paid leave.

Before joining IWF in 2003, Lukas worked on Capitol Hill as a senior domestic policy analyst for the House Republican Policy Committee and for the Cato Institute. She is a graduate of Princeton University and Harvard's Kennedy School of Government, and has five children

Tammy Bruce

Tammy is the president of Independent Women's Voice, IWF's advocacy arm. Tammy is also a Fox News Channel and Fox Business Network Political Contributor, *New York Times* bestselling author, columnist for the *Washington Times*, and the host of the "Tammy Bruce Show," a New Media radio program streaming worldwide focusing on culture and politics through an Independent Conservative prism.

A Democrat up until 2008 when she officially

became an Independent, Tammy was a 'community organizer' through the 1990s as president of the Los Angeles chapter of NOW (she's sorry), and worked on a number of Democratic campaigns. In the mid-1990s, she saw the light and embraced libertarian and conservative ideals.

Her first book, *The New Thought Police*, which focused on free speech and the rise of left-wing McCarthyism, was published in 2001. Her second book, *The Death of Right and Wrong*, also for Random House, addresses the rise of moral relativism in society and quickly became a New York Times best seller. Tammy's latest work, The New American Revolution, was published by Harper Collins/Morrow and is now available in paperback.

Tammy holds a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the University of Southern California, from which she graduated cum laude, and is a PhD candidate at Claremont Graduate University.

A native of Los Angeles, Tammy now spends most of her time in New York for work.



Abby Spencer Moffat

Abby later refined her talents as the owner of an event planning start-up.

Cynthia A. Fisher is a life sciences entrepreneur, independent investor, and corporate board director. Cynthia founded PatientRightsAdvocate. org, an advocacy organization for the American public and employers seeking to greatly reduce the cost of healthcare and coverage through systemwide price transparency and creation of a functional, competitive marketplace in healthcare. She also serves on the Health Information Technology Advisory Committee as the former Speaker of the House's appointee.

Cynthia is a public company Director of The Boston Beer Company (SAM), and Easterly Government Properties, Inc. (DEA).

Cynthia founded the pioneering cord blood stem cell banking company, ViaCord, Inc., in 1993 and served as CEO. In 2000, Cynthia co-founded the cellular medicines company, ViaCell, Inc, of which ViaCord became a division. She served as President and on the Board of Directors. ViaCell went public, was acquired by PerkinElmer, and exists today under the ViaCord brand.

Cynthia co-founded and is chairman of FitMoney.org, providing schools and teachers curriculum for K-12 financial literacy. She is a Director of the National Park Foundation, Board Advisor to Boston Children Hospital's Micheli Center for Sports Injury Prevention, and formerly served on the Board of Water.org.

Cynthia holds an MBA from Harvard Business School, as well as an Honorary Doctorate of Science and BS in Biophysics from Ursinus College.



Gracie Terzian

A native of the Washington, D.C. area, Gracie Terzian is a singer, songwriter, ukulelist, and actor now living in New York City. She gained attention in the jazz world with the release of her debut EP, *Saints and Poets*, which debuted at #23 on the Billboard jazz charts and quickly became the #3 jazz album on iTunes. As an ukulelist, she is known for playing unusual instruments, including the harp ukulele and electric ukulele.

A member of Actors' Equity Association, Gracie has worked extensively in theatre and film as an actor, singer, dancer/acrobat and composer. She has performed at many theatres including the Kennedy Center, Ford's Theatre, Shakespeare Theatre Company, Folger Theatre and the American Theatre of Actors. Gracie is also an IWF offspring. Her mother, Grace Paine Terzian, former IWF senior vice president and one of a group of early founders of the organization, raised Gracie in the midst of producing IWF's celebrated *Women's Quarterly*, and other duties.
